Current Eligibility:

Enrollment for the CSPT program is selective. Applicants must meet all eligibility requirements to be selected.

Before you apply you must:

- · Have a high school diploma or equivalent.
- Meet the transfer eligibility requirements if you're a current BJC HealthCare employee.

After you apply with BJC HealthCare you must:

- · Demonstrate academic and career readiness.
- Complete a screening interview with a BJC Talent Acquisition Specialist.
- · Complete the STLCC training application.
- Complete a full interview and be selected by BJC HealthCare staff.
- Pass a criminal background check, drug screen panel, and physical exam with proof of immunizations or titers.
